Meeting Purpose and Content

1. Josh Court from Gundersen-Lutheran regarding Behavioral Health Services: Key points:

-30 Adult beds in locked unit most often full and need for more

-8 adolescent beds that seems to be adequate

-Not enough staff for the mental health needs in our area. Short on psychiatrists-1 year wait Short on therapists as well.

-Backlog of psych evals as well

Concern then that people end up in crisis and enter the criminal system when can't get services

How solve? Ideas:

move to having primary care physicians take care of right away or go back to after psychiatrist sets up med schedule

talk of incentive programs to entice professionals to our area-like waiving state inc. tax

use of virtual provider program-like Texas doc doing online with patients here

having professionals as part of a team of primary care providers

new model in the cities called "mental health urgent care" that would provide a healing calm area for people in crisis.....like a triage. A trip to ER, although still place to go, does not always get someone in crisis help immediately.

educate community what to do in crisis and how to help those get to services need

Other Info: school district has partnership now with Gundersen-provides 2 full-time providers where students can get 5 sessions for free called "Student Assistance Program"

teen center at YMCA also where Gundersen staff is embedded in program

□ Meeting content was limited to only noticed agenda items, including business discussed in closed session.

□ A record of motions, seconds, and roll-call votes from the meeting will be (was?) created and preserved.

Good Practice for Public Accessibility Checklist

□ Copies of the agenda and handouts were available to the public. Important information was available for viewing via handouts, web links, or projector.
